to get **treatment**.

Multiple myeloma is the most common form of blood cancer in African Americans

- Multiple myeloma is about **2X more common** in African Americans vs White Americans. In fact, **1 in 5** people with multiple myeloma is African American
- Diagnosing multiple myeloma can be tricky in anyone. But the **time it takes to get diagnosed** is typically **longer for African Americans**
- African Americans are **less likely to get certain treatments**. However, when receiving the same treatment, African Americans do **just as well as and sometimes better** than White Americans
