





African Americans with multiple myeloma are:

More likely to be diagnosed

Less likely to get treatment.



Multiple myeloma is the most common form of blood cancer in African Americans

- Multiple myeloma is about **2X more common** in African Americans vs White Americans. In fact, **1 in 5** people with multiple myeloma is African American
- Diagnosing multiple myeloma can be tricky in anyone. But the time it takes to get diagnosed is typically longer for African Americans
- African Americans are less likely to get certain treatments. However, when receiving the same treatment, African Americans do just as well as and sometimes better than White Americans
