Endometriosis

Endometriosis happens when tissue from the uterus grows outside of it, attaching to the ovaries, tubes, or even the bowel or bladder.

Endometriosis affects about five million American women. It is a painful condition, sometimes known as "the silent struggle," and often years pass before it's diagnosed.

Too often, Black women who have symptoms receive a misdiagnosis at first.

Know the warning signs:

- Pelvic pain/cramps that get worse over time.
- A history of lengthy, profuse periods.
- Pain during sex or when using the bathroom, especially when menstruating.
- Trouble getting pregnant.
