Autism Awareness Month

Autism, or autism spectrum disorder (ASD), refers to a broad range of conditions that show up as challenges with social skills, verbal and nonverbal communication and unwanted repetitive behaviors.

ASD affects children and adults of all ethnicities. In Black communities, children tend to be diagnosed later. This leads to delays in receiving essential services.

Recognizing the signs of autism in early childhood is vital. Signs include:

- Delayed speech development.
- Not responding to their name.
- Avoiding eye contact.
- Not smiling if you smile at them.
- Repetitive movements: flapping or flipping their fingers or hands, or rocking their body.

Encouragingly, efforts to address autism in our community are on the rise.
