- Black Americans, especially women, are 40% more likely to have asthma
- Black children are 8 times more likely to die from asthma than white children

Black communities are exposed to more air pollution, making it a major trigger for asthma attacks. But many causes exist inside the home too:

- Mold and dust
- Secondhand smoke from cigarettes and weed
- Pet fur and feathers
- Cockroaches
- Household sprays
- Nitrogen dioxide from gas appliances

Regular check-ups can ensure that asthma is properly managed. Furthermore, our communities must demand cleaner air quality and a reduction in environmental pollutants.
